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FOREWORD

Circular A-110 applies to Federal agencies that administer grants to institutions of higher education, hospitals and other quasi-public and non-profit organizations. Its provisions also apply to subrecipients performing substantive work under grants or contracts that are passed through or awarded by the primary recipient. (If the subrecipient is a State, local government, or Indian Tribal government, the subrecipient is required to follow the provisions of Circular A-102). The agencies, for years preceding this Circular, had imposed varying and conflicting requirements on the above grantees. The purpose of A-110 is to streamline and make those requirements uniform.

Headquarters personnel may direct their questions on the material in the Handbook to the Office of Procurement and Contracts. Field personnel may direct their questions to the respective Regional Contracting Officer.

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
