

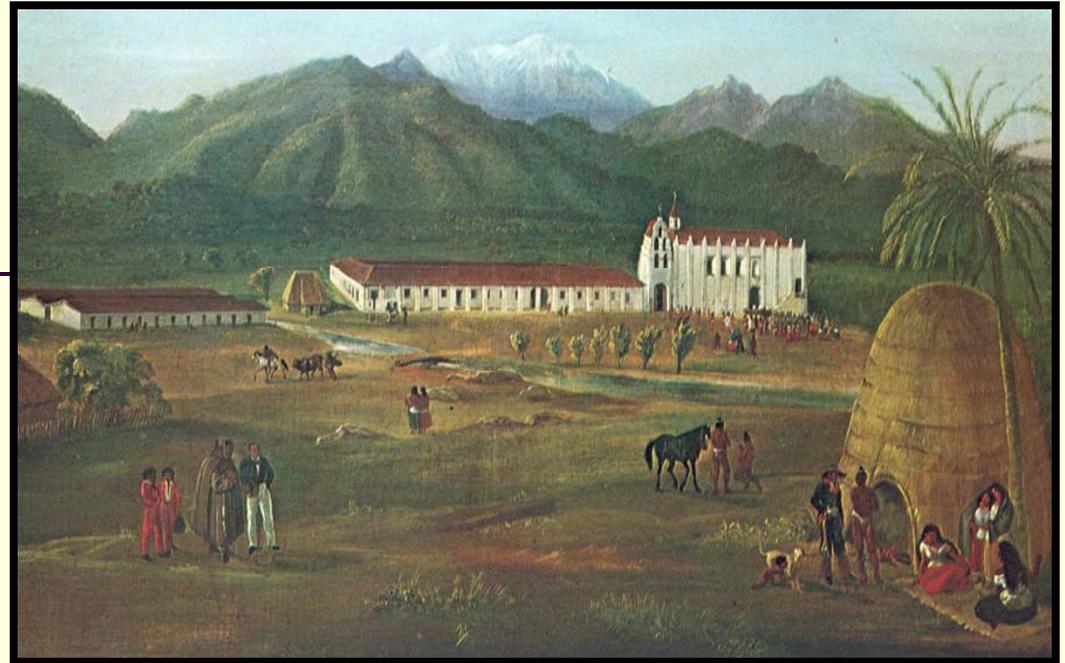


CITY OF SAN GABRIEL

Birthplace of the Los Angeles Region

HISTORY

- ❖ Home to San Gabriel Mission (f. 1771)
- ❖ 4th mission established in chain of 21 California missions.
- ❖ Original European settlement south of San Luis Obispo and north of San Diego.
- ❖ The spiritual, agricultural and economic center of what are now the Los Angeles and Orange county regions – and the heart and soul of this great Valley that bears its name.
- ❖ The Mission supported and helped found neighboring communities including El Pueblo de la Reina de Los Angeles – today the great metropolitan City of Los Angeles.



TODAY ~ Things have changed a little in the last 200+ years

- ❖ San Gabriel – a mix of small town charm with international flair.
- ❖ Unique homes, neighborhoods, business opportunities and a destination for tourism.
- ❖ Visitors can enjoy two distinct districts:
 - ❖ **Historic Mission District** – for the charm of early California
 - ❖ **Valley Boulevard** – offering an only-in-America experience of Asian culture and cuisine
- ❖ The community has substantial commercial land, is well-connected to regional transportation, and possesses a rich and diverse demographic base.



DEMOGRAPHICS

- ❖ 4.4 square miles
- ❖ 42,184 current population
- ❖ 56.6% Asian, 28.5% White, 26.8% Hispanic
- ❖ 38.1 median age
- ❖ 13,060 households in 2008
- ❖ \$65,689 average household income
- ❖ 75% of households are families
- ❖ 24% of population with college degrees



SGVEWP PARTNERSHIP



- ❖ The Mission had the *Archangel Gabriel* and *Charlie's Angels* totaled three.
- ❖ At the City Council meeting of June 17, 2008 another divine coalition arrived in San Gabriel (*three wise women from the East-Irwindale*) from SCE and Intergy Corporation preaching a new **Gospel** . . .
 - ❖ The Gospel of the “**Energy Conservation Program**” in the San Gabriel Valley and the San Gabriel Valley Energywise Partnership.
- ❖ City informed it could qualify for **3x** the normal rebate for energy savings completed by **November 2008**.
- ❖ City staff directed to convene and facilitate a meeting between City, SCE and Intergy Corp. representatives
 - ❖ Purpose: Explore projects feasible given the time frame and eligible for rebates.

 - ❖ **Fire Dept.:** Fire Chief Joseph Nestor and Battalion Chief Michael Terry
 - ❖ **Mission Playhouse:** Manager Ann Cross, Stage Managers Richard Godinez, Joe Leach and Auditorium Facilities Coordinator Steve Wilkinson

 - ❖ **Police Dept.:** Police Lieutenant Andrew Borrello

The Process

July 8, 2008 “Team Sparky” Discussion, Q & A results in:

- ❖ Some projects identified “feasible” given November 2008 timeframe
- ❖ Developed calendar for implementation:
 - ❖ **Week of July 14th:** Site visits/evaluation of City facilities: City Hall, Police, Fire, Mission Playhouse and Public Works
 - ❖ **July / August:** Projects ID'd for implementation finalized
 - ❖ **August – October 30th:** Implementation (*Unsung Heroes!)
 - ❖ (*)City departments help each other – Parks and Recreation and Public Works maintenance staff identified projects they could complete, and projects beyond their scope
 - ❖ **Week of 8/17:** SCE, Intergy Corporation and contractor / vendor complete visits and evaluation of all City sites
 - ❖ **8/29:** Bids received
 - ❖ **November:** Applications written and submitted for rebate
 - ❖ **December 2008:** SGVEWP and SCE present the City with rebate

Projects/Facilities Description –

Or – It's all Greek to me!

- ❖ **Adult Center and Recreation Center:** Upgrade T-12 fixtures to T-8 with electronic ballasts, replace halogen/incandescent lamps with CFLs, relamp metal halide lamps, install lighting controls and install occupancy sensor control on vending machine
- ❖ **City Hall:** Install occupancy sensors and upgrade T-12 to T-8
- ❖ **Fire Departments:** Upgrade T-12 to T-8, replace halogen and incandescent with CFL, and replace metal halide to induction
- ❖ **Mission Playhouse:** Upgrade T-12 to T-8, replace halogen and incandescent to CFL, replace EXIT signs, and metal halide to induction, and replace stage lighting instruments with Source 4's
- ❖ **Police Department:** Upgrade T-12 to T-8, replace halogen and incandescent to CFL, install vendingmizer, and LED EXIT signs
- ❖ **Traffic Street Signs:** Replaced some T-12 street signs with reflectors



IT PAYS TO SAVE ~

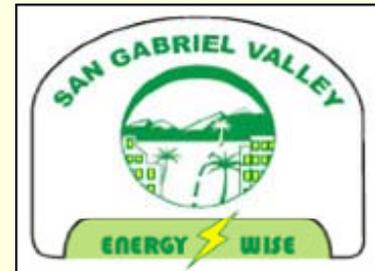
kWh Savings & Dollar Rebate

- ❖ December 2008: SCE and San Gabriel Valley Energywise Partnership award the City of San Gabriel with a check for **\$50,206.41** “*for its work to conserve energy*”
- ❖ Verified Energy Savings: Almost 334,708 kWh per year
- ❖ Significant savings on monthly energy bills
- ❖ Savings of \$46,856 in energy and maintenance costs per year with the newly installed energy-efficient lighting equipment
- ❖ Reduced carbon dioxide emissions by 267 tons per year
- ❖ 602 barrels of oil not burned

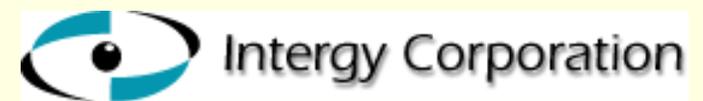
