Relocation and Real Property Acquisition  
**PRIVACY ACT STATEMENT**

**Authority:** The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) is authorized to collect this information pursuant to the Housing and Community Development Act of 1987, 42 U.S.C. 3543, the U.S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1437 et seq., and the Housing and Community Development Act of 1981, P.L. 97-35, 85 stat., 34, 408.

**Intended Use of Information:** The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that the \_\_\_\_\_, herein referred to as the Agency, collect income and housing information for the purpose of determining relocation assistance in accordance with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (URA), as amended, and if applicable, with section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The data it will collect include name, sex, birth date, Social Security Number (SSN), income (by source), assets, certain deductible expenses, rental payment, utility costs, and if voluntarily provided, information related to mobility and other special needs.

**Routine Uses of Information:** HUD will use the information to manage and monitor HUD-assisted housing programs. It also may verify whether the information is accurate and complete by doing a computer match.

HUD may give the information to Federal, State, and local agencies when it will be used for civil, criminal or regulatory investigations and prosecutions. HUD also may make summaries of resident data available to the public. Other than these uses, HUD will not release the information outside HUD, except as permitted or required by law.

**Penalty:** The Housing and Community Development Act of 1987, 42 U.S.C. 3543 requires applicants and residents to give the Agency the SSNs of household members at least six (6) years old. If you are an applicant and you have been issued or use SSN(s) and you do not give them to the Agency, or refuse to disclose other income-related information, the Agency may elect to disregard the income of the household in calculating a displaced residential person's replacement housing assistance. If you are receiving housing assistance and you have been issued or use SSN(s), you must disclose such assistance in order to avoid a duplication of payment so as to ensure the Agency is in compliance with the requirement to avoid fraud, waste and abuse.

The U.S. Housing Act of 1937, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1437 et. seq., and the Housing and Community Development Act of 1981, P.L. 97-35, 85 stat., 348, 408 require applicants and residents to provide the other information (listed in the second paragraph) to the Agency. If you are an applicant and you fail to give the Agency this information, the Agency may have to reject your claim for assistance or delay acting on it. If you are receiving housing assistance and you do not advise the Agency of such assistance, the housing assistance you now receive may be terminated to avoid a duplication of payment and to ensure that the Agency is in compliance with the requirement to avoid fraud, waste and abuse.
