The Forest Housing Authority has attempted to provide all the necessary information and documentation for the annual and five year plan. We have included adopted new policies and procedures to comply with current regulation and guidelines. Our plan is focusing on improving the quality of life for our residents through training and education, security and physical improvements.

The Housing Authority to achieve its mission and goals under the five year plan will focus on improving the quality of life for its residents, promoting self-sufficiency through education and training, ensuring equal opportunity and fair housing, safe environment and physical improvements. We work very closely with community agencies and organizations. Under our capital fund program, we are making our developments more energy efficient, attractive and drug free. The Housing Authority has included in this plan all policies and procedures in accordance with HUD regulations.

The Housing Authority of Forest has suspended its enforcement of the 8-hour community service requirement after a 30 day notice on January 1, 2002. We will not enforce this provision of our Admissions and Continued Occupancy Policy so long as Congress provides for the option to not enforce it. In taking this action we still want to encourage our public housing residents to both participate in their community and enhance their self-sufficiency skills in a truly voluntary manner.

### **C. Criteria for Substantial Deviation and Significant Amendments**

- Any changes with regard to demolition or disposition, designation, homeownership programs or conversion activities.

These issues, if required, shall be raised with proper public notification. The Housing Authority acknowledges that an exception will be made by HUD to comply with the above changes that are adopted to reflect changes in HUD regulatory requirements: such changes will not be considered significant amendments by HUD.
