HUD Strategic Goal: Increase the availability of decent, safe, and affordable housing.

Expand the supply of assisted housing

The Authority continues to pursue opportunities to leverage private or other public funds to create additional housing opportunities or to acquire or build units or developments in the upcoming year.

Improve the quality of assisted housing

The Punta Gorda Housing Authority has continued to maintain high scores in both the SEMAP and PHAS.

The Authority has begun the demolition of the three developments that were damaged during the destruction by Hurricane Charley in August of 2004. The units at the Gulf Breeze and Dolphin Villas developments have been knocked down and now are just in need of removal of the slab infrastructure. The contract to begin demolition activity at Riverview is on the verge of being completed, and demolition of that development should be completed by April of 2006.

The Authority has continued to strive to undertake affirmative measures to ensure access to assisted housing regardless of race, color, religion national origin, sex, familial status, and disability.
