## **ATTACHMENT – Follow-Up Plans for Resident Service and Satisfaction Survey**

### **Neighborhood Appearance**

Maintaining and improving the appearance of our developments is very important to the Fayetteville Housing Authority because the appearance of a neighborhood is a reflection of the people who live and work there. We are constantly trying to improve the overall appearance of developments. Recently, we demolished units in our Scales development and landscaped the area. In our Mayberry Development, our Community Center, along with the playground, pavilion, trees, parking lot, walking/tracking and increased lighting adds to the overall appearance of that development. Garbage dumpsters are provided to give residents more access to dispose garbage. Maintenance staff cut and trim overgrown vegetation and plant grass where needed to avoid erosion and to promote grass growth. We conduct outdoor inspections on a weekly basis, which are aimed at maintaining a nice scenic view. Tenants are notified of existing problems as well as how to make the necessary corrections. If problems are affecting the development as a whole, letters, newsletter and memos are sent to residents to inform them on specific issues. Units are being remodeled inside and out to keep a more modern look as well as for comfort. Central air and heating units have been added to most apartments. Our police officers tag and tow abandoned vehicles. We are always open to residents for suggestions and want our neighborhoods to be safe, clean and attractive; a place where the community as a whole can be proud. During our monthly Resident Council Meetings a segment is provided for residents to express any concerns about their neighborhoods. We are constantly striving to improve and maintain the appearance of our communities.

### **Communication**

The Fayetteville Housing Authority communicates with residents through correspondence, newsletters, flyers, verbal communication and posted notices. Every month we print calendars and newsletters that are on the counter for residents to pick up when they pay their rent. Rules of the lease are thoroughly gone over with the tenant at the time of lease signing, and rules of the safety handbook are reviewed with the tenant once they move in. Certain event notices are passed out, posted on the office door or mailed. Our Housing Authority Staff is courteous, professional and will continue to strive to answer all questions and concerns. Management has a segment for the Executive Director, Maintenance Staff and the Resident Services Coordinator in the resident Council Meetings. Calendars post the meetings in monthly and yearly calendars. As with all of our categories for us to improve, we will strive to get better and do everything possible to improve the quality of housing for our tenants.
