Resident Advisory Board Meeting

Residents meet quarterly with Housing Authority Staff to discuss pertinent issues. On March 18, 2008, in culmination of the past year's meetings the main areas of concern were addressed by the following Resident Advisory Board members:

Goals were discussed throughout all meetings. They would like to have more services available for the senior citizens. Items discussed were the feasibility of having exercise classes weekly for seniors. They will contact various colleges in the area to see if students are available to assist and investigate with HACE staff any insurance liabilities. Also suggested was having a Nintendo Game System, (the Wii) set up at different sites on a rotating weekly basis for seniors, monitored by a volunteer to set-up and conduct sessions. A few of the games suggested were Sports and Brain Age, for cognitive as well as physical manipulation. The Board thought it would be a good idea to have a "Christmas Window Decoration" contest. The resident with the best decorated window for Christmas would be given a gift card or cash prize.

Security issues were again a primary concern. A more visible police presence was requested at all sites to deter crime, specifically drug activity. The staff advised residents that cameras are being priced for Mravlag Manor and if feasible will be installed. They are very satisfied with work that's being done at Mravlag Manor, but are concerned that the cameras will be damaged. Residents would also like to see more police presence.

REPLACEMENT HOUSING FACTOR NARRATIVE FOR THE ANNUAL PLAN 2008

The Housing Authority of the City of Elizabeth submitted a plan for the Replacement Housing Factor which was approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Developments. HACE intends to use its' RHF Grant allocation to implement a Mixed-Finance Development Program by leveraging infill sites within the City of Elizabeth. Presently, HACE has partnered with the Elizabeth Development Corporation (EDC) who was designated by the City as a re-developer for two sites presently owned by the City. HACE is submitting a Low-Income Housing Tax-Credit Application on April 23rd, 2008 for a Mixed-Use Project which consists of 30 One-Bedroom Senior Citizen Apartments; 10 Public Housing Replacement Units and 20 Tax-Credit Units, with approximately 4,000 Sq. Ft. of commercial space and a Two-Bedroom Manager's Unit. The project is the first development in which HACE will be utilizing the RHF funds.

The overall RHF Program inclusive of the Senior Development for HACE will consist of approximately 80 units; 45% will be ACC units.

The attached is the anticipated budget for the use of the RHF Grant and other resources within the Mixed-Finance Development Strategy.
