We have successfully reduced our vacancies and for January through June 2009, we have an average rate of 99.5% occupied. Our waiting list is also at 36, which reflects approximately a six month wait. Our Housing Choice Voucher program is averaging 98.7% utilization for January through June 2009. We are updating our public housing units through the capital fund program in a timely manner. Currently, we are working on projects to utilize the balance of our 2007 funding, our 2008 funding is 82.3% committed and our 2009 stimulus capital funding is 82.7% committed. We plan to continue to maintain our high performer score in SEMAP, which was 145 out of 145 in 2008. Our PHA's score for 2007 was 95 out of 100, although we feel this is a good score, we plan to increase the physical indicator score by continued improvements to our buildings.</b></p> <p><b>To increase housing choices, we attempted to re-organize the South St. Paul Landlord Coalition, but were unsuccessful. We plan to coordinate with Dakota County CDA, to utilize the Dakota County Coalition for our landlords.</b></p>

Our current waiting list for the Housing Choice Voucher program is at 420 families. The average age of the head of household is 29, average family size is 3, and the average income is \$13,000. During the year of 2009, we have reduced the number of families on our waiting list by 500. The decrease is due to families leasing up, because we have had a number of families port to other jurisdictions and the family was absorbed. Other families have dropped off of our waiting list, because they were on multiple waiting lists and have been issued a voucher in another jurisdiction. Most of the families on our waiting list require a two bedroom apartment, which we will be able to accommodate once we have openings. Currently our waiting list is closed, but by the end of 2009, we will have to reopen the waiting list.</b></p> <p><b>Our public housing waiting list is open at all times and we currently have 38 individuals/families on the waiting list. At the end of 2008, there were 50 individuals/families. During the year of 2007, we had a turnover rate of 52 apartments; in 2008, we had a turnover rate of 73. During the year of 2010, we will continue to accept applicants on to our public housing waiting list and we expect we will have a turnover rate of approximately 40 apartments.</b></p>

On Thursday August 6, 2009 at 2:00 PM, the Resident Advisory Board (RAB) met in the conference room at the South St. Paul HRA administrative offices. The people in attendance were:

During the meeting, we discussed items we are tentatively going to update at the buildings with our 2009 and 2010 Capital Funding. Everyone agreed the items chosen to be performed on the building were needed and would improve the ambience of the buildings. We received very positive responses to the installation of air conditioners in each unit and the updating of the community rooms at each high-rise. While discussing the updating of the front sitting area at the John Carroll high-rise, one suggestion was to install bars on the glass in the lobby area. There has been issues in the past of residents hitting the glass with their scooters and the glass breaking. Currently, we have installed protective glass and bars, but when we bid the project we will include additional bars to protect the glass.

Wanda Kveen suggested we use the flag pole that was removed from the front of the John Carroll building and install it in the back sitting area. We agreed to research the project and install the pole in the back as long as the cost was reasonable. Wanda has agreed to work with the VFW on obtaining new flags for both buildings.

Mary Zeverino commented her blinds in the living-room fall when she tries to close them. Cherise has agreed to analyze the situation and correct the issue by either rehanging the blinds so they do not fall or replacing the blinds if they are not fitting properly.

Mary Zeverino mentioned her kitchen sink keeps backing up at odd times of the day. She mentioned her neighbor is having the same issue. Cherise has agreed to hire a contractor to evaluate the issue and correct the problem.

The group, also, commented on the responsiveness and hard work of the HRA staff assigned to the buildings. The group was very positive about the improvements made to the buildings so far.
