DISMISSAL ORDER

This matter is before the Court upon Petitioner's request for a hearing concerning the Secretary's intent to garnish Petitioner's wages to collect a debt allegedly owed to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD").

On September 24, 2025, the Secretary of HUD moved for dismissal of this matter without prejudice, stating that he has determined that garnishment of Petitioner's wages at this time would create financial hardship.¹ The Secretary maintains that Petitioner owes a past-due and legally enforceable debt and reserves the right to again pursue administrative wage garnishment against Petitioner in the future should her financial circumstances change.

For good cause shown, the *Secretary's Motion to Dismiss* is **GRANTED** and this matter is **DISMISSED** without prejudice.

¹ While the Secretary's motion was pending, a lapse in appropriations occurred that resulted in the longest federal government shutdown in history and the closure of this Court from October 1, 2025, to November 13, 2025. Due to this closure, a *Notice and Stay of Proceedings* was issued on October 1, 2025, staying all matters pending before the Court, including the instant matter. The Court has now reopened, and the stay of this matter is therefore **LIFTED**.
