SUBJECT: Tribal Housing and Urban Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing Program – Expansion Notice

Dear Tribal Leader:

I am pleased to announce that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD's) Office of Native American Programs has published <u>PIH Notice 2025-02 (Revised)</u> for the Tribal Housing and Urban Development-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (Tribal HUD-VASH) program.

Under this Notice, approximately \$2.2 million is available for eligible Indian tribes and Tribally Designated Housing Entities (TDHEs) to provide housing and supportive services to Native American Veterans who are experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness.

Applicants have until **11:59:59 PM EST on August 15, 2025**, to submit applications via www.grants.gov. If you are unable submit your application electronically, please contact TribalHUDVASH@hud.gov to request a waiver to this requirement.

Please note that applications **must** include a letter of support from their partnering U.S Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) medical facility's Director. **I strongly encourage you to contact the VA now to start the process**. The letter must affirm that the Indian tribe or TDHE has consulted with its local VA facility and that the VA is committed to providing case management services should the applicant be awarded a grant. If you are not familiar with your local VA facility, you can find a list online (https://www.va.gov/find-locations) or by contacting your local VA Homeless Program Coordinator (https://www.va.gov/homeless/).
