SUBJECT: Church/State Issues and the Determination of CDBG Eligibility

This memorandum is intended to provide further guidance on the application of First Amendment Church/State regulations to the use of Community Development Block Grant assistance. This guidance specifically involves the use of such funds by certain for-profit businesses.

It has come to my attention that some field office shave recently been called upon to address HUD/Church State eligibility issues in connection with the use of CDBG assistance to for-profit businesses engaged in the sale of goods or services with religious themes (such as religious bookstores). These businesses are not affiliated with a primarily religious entity or organization. You are advised that, as a general rule, the Church/State requirements at 24 CFR §570.200(j) do not prohibit the provision of CDBG assistance to for-profit businesses. In this regard, the sale of goods with a religious theme by such businesses does not constitute an impermissible religious activity under the CDBG Church/State requirements.

If you are contacted to make a determination on the eligibility of a proposed use of CDBG funds which involves Church/State issues, you should of course continue to apply the requirements at 24 CFR §570.200(j).
