@Alyssa - for these projects, HUD did not limit eligibility for the projects to those experiencing unsheltered homelessness. Instead, eligibility for Unsheltered Set Aside projects is category 1 and 4 of the homeless definition and for the Rural Set Aside projects is category 1, 2, and 4 of the homeless definition. But, all projects have to be consistent with the CoC's plan to serve individuals and families experiencing homelessness with severe service needs, which includes a strategy for reducing unsheltered homelessness in the CoC's geographic area.

@Lois Gaetz - You should complete the applicable level of ERR as soon as you have the building address. Best practice is to prepare the ERR with the building address without unit numbers so the entire building is then covered by that review.

@Jamie - most in-kind documentation does not include client-specific data. It generally reflects the time of volunteers to assist eligible program participants. If for some reason there is client-data involved, this should be in the recipient's/subrecipient's records. If that documentation needs to be provided to HUD for as part of a monitoring or for some other reason the recipient should redact any client identifiers when providing evidence of documentation.

@John - this is where it is going to be very important to check-in with your CoC and gather more information about their plan for serving individuals and families experiencing homelessness with severe service needs that you are expected to be consistent with in operating your project. From HUD's perspective, individuals and families living in emergency shelter are considered homeless under Category 1 and are thus eligible for projects funded under this NOFO. But, you also have to be consistent with your CoC's plan so you will want to check with your CoC.

@William, thanks! We provide in-kind I health services as the County Health Department so match documentation is generally at the client level. Usually we utilize HMIS identifiers to generate reports, but DV specific projects are challenging in this regard

@Maggie: UFAs may use up to 3 percent of their FPRN, or a maximum amount to be established by the NOFA, whichever is less, for fiscal control and accounting costs necessary to assure the proper disbursal of, and accounting for, federal funds awarded to subrecipients under the Continuum of Care program.

@ George: it depends on your project type if HUD already completed the appropriate level of review for your project. In recent years, HUD has been completing lower levels of reviews over larger geographic

@ Susan - that is correct. for capital costs (rehab, acquisition, and construction) you have 24 months after signing the grant agreement. So those funds will be spent before the 3 years are over

@Susan - if you have funds for rehabilitation you can start drawing your rehabilitation costs first. Then when the rehabilitation is done (you have up to two years to finish rehabilitation) and you start serving clients that is when the 3-year clock starts for those projects.

@Connie - the quarterly reporting will not begin until January 2024. At that point, all grants that were operating prior to January 1 should be reporting. If you start a grant after that you would not begin reporting until the subsequent reporting quarter (in April). There will be more training on reporting.

ESNAPS only lists rent utility assistance, short-term lodging, repairs to units for habitability, emergency food and clothing assistance, and costs to make federal inventory property for people experiencing homelessness. It did not list section 2 capacity building activities as a line-item in the ESNAPS budget. Were these ever eligible for us? Did HUD limit the types of funding from the eligible list of items or will there be future opportunities to move funds into these other line items?
