@Rachael Sample - all projects that get awarded will have a reporting requirement. For most reports there is a quarterly reporting requirement. However, the HMIS, SSO-CE, CoC Planning, and UFA Costs grants will only have to report on an annual basis.

@Valerie - HMIS participation is based on access to data from the entire year but it can be uploaded one time or on a more regular basis. We know that most CoCs have projects that don't regularly participate

in HMIS but they do an annual update of the data on the clients served. That works. The HIC will be the core source for how we evaluate HMIS Bed Coverage.

@Courtney - if you have a project that starts on 12/1 you would begin your reporting on 1/1/24. This is because your project was operating during the period immediately prior to the beginning of the reporting period (which begins 1/1/24). That initial report will only have 1 month of data in it. That's okay. We know that the first report will have smaller numbers.

@Brie - consent is really important and can be tricky. Consent comes into play in 2 ways. First, in the data collection, and second, in the sharing. The recipient is expected to ask for all of the relevant data from clients. The client can choose to not answer but they will need to do that for each question you ask. We want to emphasize that this is a client decision and not a caseworker decision. We have run into scenarios where caseworkers prefer not to ask the questions or assume the answers and act accordingly. That is not okay. But it IS okay for clients to not answer any given question. If a client does not consent to share it means that you cannot share their client level data to other organizations in your system. However, you can (and should) still include their data in the aggregate data you report to HUD (and other aggregate data). This is not a violation.
