Consultation

The City of Passaic consulted with the PHA and CoC serving our jurisdiction. The City historically works with nonprofit organizations in the delivery of programs and services of its' CDBG and HOME programs. As a result, several of the nonprofit organizations were consulted in the drafting of the HOME ARP Allocation Plan. The organizations and entities consulted provide housing and services to the eligible populations designated by the United States

Department of Housing and Urban Development. These organizations and entities have relevant knowledge of the needs, service gaps and potential activities that would best benefit the qualified populations.

In addition to nonprofit organizations and entities that provide services and programs to the eligible population, the Department of Community Development hosted a public meeting to consult with residents and stakeholders to gather their input concerning the HOME ARP grant; the qualifying populations, eligible activities, and proposed budget. The following table summarizes the organizations and entities consulted and the feedback received.



Public Participation

The Department of Community Development posted a public notice in El Especial on June 3, 2022 and in The Herald News on May 31, 2022. The public notice announced the availability of HOME ARP funds provided to the City of Passaic and the purpose and usage of these funds. The July 21, 2022 public hearing was to gather input from the citizens and stakeholders about the use of HOME ARP funds. The Department of Community Development held its public meeting on July 21, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. There were 11 individuals who participated in the meeting, including staff members of the Department of Community Development. There was no comments provided during the public meeting. Immediately following the meeting, the presentation was shared with the invited stakeholders.

Additionally, the July 20, 2022 meeting with the Continuum of Care allowed the Department of Community Development to gather their input into the City of Passaic's use of their HOME ARP funds. There were 42 individuals who attended the Passaic County COC meeting on July 20, 2022. The Department of Community Development conducted a presentation for the COC outlining the preliminary HOME ARP plan and proposed activity. There were no comments received.

On July 28, 2022, the City of Passaic distributed an email to the COC partners and other organizations required for consultation requesting feedback on the City's use of its HOME ARP allocation. The feedback was requested via a Google form survey. There were ten responses to the survey, which have been included in the feedback consultation chart.

The Department of Community Development posted a second public notice announcing the availability of the draft HOME ARP Allocation plan outlining the activities that will be undertaken by the City of Passaic using the HOME ARP funds.

Describe any efforts to broaden public participation:

The City followed its' adopted Citizen Participation process; however, the length of the public comment period was shortened to 15 calendar days based on guidance from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Comments received from residents, organizations and entities which were received in writing or orally at the public hearing; as well as during the consultation process, were considered in the preparation of the HOME ARP Allocation Plan.

Summarize the comments and recommendations received through the public participation process:

The comments received spoke to the lack of affordable housing in the City of Passaic and the limited availability of assistance for members of the qualifying population to avail themselves of housing that is available. Communication was another key area that was commented upon. There needs to be increased communication between public agencies, homeless service providers and the qualifying populations about the needs of the population and availability of funding and programming.

Summarize any comments or recommendations not accepted and state the reasons why: There were several comments about the City of Passaic using their HOME ARP funds for nonprofit operating support. These comments were reviewed, but not considered. The City of Passaic utilized non-HUD ARP funds to provide grants to non-profit and churches.

Describe the size and demographic composition of qualifying populations within the PJ's boundaries:

The City of Passaic utilized the most recent Comprehensive Affordability Strategy (CHAS) data provided by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. The data was based on the 2014-2018 American Community Survey data set.

Describe the unmet housing and service needs of qualifying populations, including but not limited to:

- Sheltered and unsheltered homeless populations;
- Those currently housed populations at risk of homelessness;
- Other families requiring services or housing assistance or to prevent homelessness; and,
- Those at greatest risk of housing instability or in unstable housing situations:

According to data supplied by the CoC for Passaic County, a total of 326 persons had contacted the NJ211 Passaic Coordinated Entry system and were counted in HMIS as experiencing issues of homelessness during the time frame from 10/16/21 through 11/16/22. Of these households, 51 were fleeing domestic violence. At the time of the 2022 CoC Point in Time survey, 42 households reported fleeing from domestic violence. Given the lack of available affordable housing units in the County, including the City, many of these households are facing homelessness creating an unmet need. Data provided by the Housing Authority of the City of Passaic indicated over 1,000 households on their waiting list for affordable housing units and over 2,000 households on their waiting list for housing choice vouchers. HACP only had nine vacant units, further documenting the need for additional affordable housing units in the City. The numbers do not reflect the specific unmet housing and service needs of qualifying populations for the City of Passaic, because the numbers provided by the Continuum of Care are county-wide figures.

Identify and consider the current resources available to assist qualifying populations, including congregate and non-congregate shelter units, supportive services, TBRA, and affordable and permanent supportive rental housing:

The City of Passaic does not have any resources dedicated to assist qualifying populations.

Identify any gaps within the current shelter and housing inventory as well as the service delivery system:

Based on the responses to the City of Passaic's HOME ARP survey, the gaps identified were:

- Not being enough housing for homeless and families
- Additional resources are needed for transitional housing and homeless shelters, especially as the number of rental evictions continues to increase. As reported by ATTOM data in its recently released Special Housing Risk report at the end of June 2022, Passaic County is the most vulnerable housing market in the United States based on housing affordability, unemployment, and rising foreclosures among other factors
- Clifton
- There seems to be a shortage in shelter services

- Availability of safe and clean options for housing for low to no income
- There is not enough supportive housing for those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless
- Not enough "specialized shelters" (women with children and families)
- Lack of affordable housing
- Informing the community

Housing instability encompasses a number of challenges faced by individuals and/or families of the qualifying population. These challenges include:

- having trouble keeping current with rental housing payments
- frequently relocation
- sleeping on the couches of relatives
- spending the majority of their household income on housing

Based on the information obtained from consultation with the Passaic County COC and the City of Passaic's HOME ARP survey, the following were identified as priority needs for the qualifying population:

1st choice- Tenant-based Rental Assistance

2nd choice- Rental Housing

2nd choice- Nonprofit Operating Support

3rd choice- Non-congregate Shelter

The level of need and gaps in shelter and housing inventory and service delivery systems was determined based on the data provided from the Passaic County Continuum of Care (COC) and the feedback received from the issuance of the City of Passaic's HOME ARP survey.

At this time, additional resources are needed for transitional housing and homeless shelters, especially as the number of rental evictions continues to increase. As reported by ATTOM data in its recently released Special Housing Risk report at the end of June 2022, Passaic County is the most vulnerable housing market in the United States based on housing affordability, unemployment, and rising foreclosures among other factors.

What gaps do you see within the City of Passaic's homeless service delivery system?

Education and outreach among those in need of transitional housing and homelessness prevention services is greatly needed. Many families, especially immigrant families with Limited English Proficiency, special needs, or newly homeless due to rental or foreclosure evictions, are unaware of how to access and/or navigate homeless services. Moreover, as a fair housing organization NJCAEF sees the need for fair housing education, outreach, and enforcement among this population as critical, as well, as most individuals - especially those faced with homelessness - are unaware of their rights or where to go if they have been violated.
