



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Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968

provided under section 8 of the 1937 Act (42 U.S.C. 1437f) pursuant to 24 CFR part 882, subpart G.

Service area means the geographical area in which the persons benefitting from the section 3 covered project reside. The service area shall not extend beyond the unit of general local government in which the section 3 covered housing program Law is supported by tregulation and will comply housing program Law is supported by the gulations in part 135. (For IHAs established by an Indian tribe as a result of the exercise of the tribe's sovereign power, is limited to the area of tribal jurisdiction.

Subcontractor means any entity (other than a person who is an employee of the contractor) which has a contract with a contractor to undertake a portion of the contractor's obligation for the performance of work generated by the expenditure of section 3 covered assistance, or arising in conmontion with a conting 9 covered section 3 shall include a provision in the NOFA that notifies applicants that section 3 and the regulations in part 135 are applicable to funding awards made under the NOFA. Additionally the NOFA shall require as an application submission requirement (which may be specified in the NOFA or application kit) a certification by the appli-

PHAs, this requirement will be met where a PHA Resolution in Support of the Application is submitted.) With respect to application evaluation, HUD will accept an applicant's certification unless there is evidence substantially challenging the certification.




Final Rule

The proposed rule seeks to improve effectiveness in several ways, including:



Promoting sustained employment and career development



Key Change

Redefining Section 3 worker





A Section 3 worker is:



A low- or very low-income individual

OR



A Youthbuild participant

OR



Employed by a Section 3 business concern

Key Change

Redefining Section 3 businesses





A Section 3 business is:



51% or more owned by low or very-low income persons

OR



75% or more labor hours are performed by low- or very low-income persons

OR



51% or more owned by current residents of public housing or Section 8-assisted housing

Key Changes

• Promote sustained employment and career development:

Focuses on labor hours instead of new hires creating an incentive for employers to invest in and retain their newly hired low-income workers.

Align Section 3 reporting with standard business practices:

Consistent with business practices which already track Davis-Bacon utilization (HUD wage rates, and with the entities' payroll systems)

Applicability and Thresholds:

- Assistance used for housing rehabilitation, housing construction, and other public construction is subject to Section 3 requirements.
- > Updated the threshold, exempting projects costing less than \$200,000
- Provides an exemption threshold for Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Home grants of costing less than \$100,000.

Reporting and Targeted Section 3 Workers:

- > Targeted Section 3 are those within the "1 Mile Radius" of the worksite.
- > Reporting and benchmarks will focus on "Targeted Section 3 Workers" representing the highest priority groups.
- Priority groups would be low and very-low income workers residing within the service area or neighborhood of the project.

Key Changes

Benchmarks:

> Set by Notice and amended periodically as necessary. HUD can alter expectations and consider tailoring the benchmarks for different geographies and/or different activities as new information becomes available.

Multiple Funding Sources:

- For handling Section 3 for recipients that receive funds through more than one HUD program, and contractors that receive payment from funds under those programs.
- Public housing financial assistance fund requirements in subpart B while the community development financial assistance may follow the requirements in subpart B or subpart C.
- ➤ Ultimately, the same data will be collected across programs for consistency; the only difference will be how it looks when reported.


Integrate Section 3 into program enforcement:

The new framework anticipates that program staff would incorporate Section 3 compliance into regular program oversight and make Section 3 a more integral part of their daily work.

Key Change

Benchmarks for Section 3 projects (covers housing rehabilitation, housing construction, and other public construction projects assisted under HUD programs that provide housing and community development financial assistance where the amount of assistance to the project exceeds *a threshold of \$200,000* (Note: This threshold will not apply to HUD's Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes programs) (That threshold is \$100,000)

Section 3 labor hours
Total labor hours $= 25\% \text{ AND} \qquad \frac{\text{Targeted Section 3 labor hours}}{\text{Total labor hours}} = 5\%$

Disaster Recovery recipients will report Section 3 labor hours using Disaster Recovery Grant Reporting System (DRGR)

DRGR Section 3 Performance Measures

- New performance measures have been created in DRGR to allow grantees to report Section 3 labor hours
- For all applicable construction activity types, grantees must now enter projected Section 3 labor hours in DRGR Action Plan activities and report actual Section 3 labor hours in the Quarterly Performance Report (QPR) for the following performance measures:
 - # of Total Labor Hours
 - # of Section 3 Labor Hours
 - # of Targeted Section 3 Labor Hours

DRGR Section 3 Applicable Activity Types

- Acquisition, construction, reconstruction of public facilities
- Affordable Rental Housing
- Clearance and Demolition
- Construction of buildings for the general conduct of government
- Construction of new housing
- Construction of new replacement housing
- Construction/reconstruction of streets
- Construction/reconstruction of water lift stations
- Construction/reconstruction of water/sewer lines or systems
- Dike/dam/stream-river bank repairs

- MIT Public Facilities and Improvements-Covered Projects Only
- MIT Public Facilities and Improvements-Non-Covered Projects
- MIT Rehabilitation/reconstruction of residential structures
- MIT Residential New Construction
- Privately owned utilities
- Rehabilitation/reconstruction of a public improvement
- Rehabilitation/reconstruction of other non-residential structures
- Rehabilitation/reconstruction of public facilities
- Rehabilitation/reconstruction of public housing
- Rehabilitation/reconstruction of residential structures

Grantee Steps for Reporting Section 3 Labor Hours

Activities Previously Setup in DRGR Action Plan:

- A grantee must review activities with applicable construction activity types and Section 3 meeting threshold requirements and provide projected accomplishments for Section 3 labor hour performance measures.
- Note: This step is required for grantees to report on these measures in the QPR.


New Activities Created in DRGR Action Plan:

- Grantees should enter projected Section 3 accomplishments when setting up new activities with the applicable construction activity types and meeting threshold requirements.
- **Note:** In instances where projections are unavailable at the time of activity selection, a grantee may enter "0" as a placeholder until actual projections are available for entry.


Reporting Section 3 Labor Hours in Quarterly Performance Report:

- Similar to how grantees report other DRGR performance measures accomplishments, Section 3 actual accomplishments are entered into the QPR for Section 3 requirements and benchmarks.
- **Note:** Once projected Section 3 measures are entered in the Action Plan, the proposed measures will appear in the data tables in the QPR as a row in the Proposed Accomplishments section.


DRGR Action Plan – Manage Activity




DRGR Action Plan – Manage Activity




DRGR Action Plan – Proposed Accomplishments




Manage Performance Report – Activity




Manage Performance Report – Edit Accomplishments
