RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On or about December 14, 2020, Petitioner was ordered to file documentary evidence, on or before January 13, 2021, to prove that Petitioner is not indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated April 21, 2020. Petitioner failed to comply with that *Order*. Even taking into account the delays caused by the Covid pandemic, Petitioner has had more than ample time to come forward with documentary evidence to support Petitioner's position. Thus, Petitioner has failed to respond to the Secretary's documentary evidence showing that Petitioner is indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. Petitioner's failure to respond to the *Notice of Docketing* also prevents the Court from being able to fully evaluate any claim of financial hardship. Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *sua sponte*, and *without prejudice*. The Stay of Referral to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered on April 21, 2020, is hereby VACATED.
