## RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On September 16, 2020, Petitioner was ordered to file documentary evidence, on or before October 30, 2020, in support of his position in this case. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated September 16, 2020. Petitioner failed to comply with the September 16, 2020 *Order*. The Court notes for the record, that the Secretary indicates an intent to reduce the monthly garnishment amount to 10% of Petitioner's disposable pay rather than the 15% allowable ceiling, notwithstanding Petitioner's failure to produce specific proof of payment of necessary household expenses. Upon consideration, it is

**ORDERED** that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *sua sponte*, and *without prejudice*. It is

**FURTHER ORDERED** that the *Stay of Referral* of this matter to the U.S. Department of the Treasury, previously entered in this case on or about September 4, 2020, is hereby VACATED.
