RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On or about July 14, 2021, Petitioner was ordered to file documentary evidence, on or before August 30, 2021, to prove that Petitioner is not indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral,* dated July 14, 2021. Although Petitioner filed a narrative summary of the circumstances surrounding Petitioner's failure to pay the debt claimed by the Secretary in this case, Petitioner failed to file documentary evidence to effectively oppose the *Secretary's Statement* with accompanying documentary evidence. Therefore, Petitioner has failed to comply with the *July 14th Order*. Even taking into account the delays caused by the Covid pandemic, Petitioner has had more than ample time to come forward with documentary evidence concerning this loan. Petitioner's failure to comply with the *July 14th Order* also prevents the Court from being able to fully evaluate any claim of financial hardship. The *Secretary's Motion to Correct Claim Number* to 721017382 in this case is also GRANTED. Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *sua sponte*, and *without prejudice*. The Stay of Referral to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered on July 14, 2021, is hereby VACATED.
