## **RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

On or about September 22, 2021, Petitioner was ordered to file documentary evidence, on or before October 25, 2021, to prove that Petitioner is not indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. *Order to Show Cause Why This Appeal Should Not Be Dismissed*, dated September 22, 2021. Petitioner failed to comply with that *Order*. Even taking into account the delays caused by the Covid pandemic, Petitioner has had more than ample time to come forward with documentary evidence. Petitioner's failure to comply with the *September 22nd Show Cause Order* also prevents the Court from being able to fully evaluate any claim of financial hardship. Accordingly, it is

**ORDERED** that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *sua sponte*, and *without prejudice*. The Stay of Referral to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered on July 15, 2021, is hereby VACATED.
