Overview

Contract (IGA) Focus: Develop a structure to build informational capacity about childhood lead poisoning and Healthy Homes concepts through parents, the medical community, and advocacy groups.

- Services to Enrolled Families:
 - Facilitate culturally sensitive lead poisoning prevention awareness information and Healthy Homes education to enrolled families
 - Pre- & post education and client satisfaction questionnaires
 - Lead poisoning awareness education
 - Pre- & post blood draw results
 - Additional assessments and referrals, as needed



Lead Safe Phoenix – Our Partner in Health

Maricopa County Department of Public Health

Overview

- Customized Programs and Referrals:
 - Develop and coordinate customized programs for community health centers, i.e., “Mimi Mouse Washes Her Hands”
 - Develop educational materials and referrals for families with high-risk infants and children enrolled in programs offered by the Office of Family Health (prenatal programs, expectant mothers, etc.), including OFH staff.
- Public and Group Education:
 - Develop grass roots level public education programs on childhood lead poisoning prevention and Healthy Homes concepts for health centers, school nurses, advocacy groups, neighborhood and parent organizations.
