## VISITOR IDs TO ENTER FEDERAL BUILDINGS

In general, Federal building hours of operation are from 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Visitors to agencies within a Federal building should check with that agency for its respective business hours. Attendees must present identification such as:

- Driver's licenses or other state photo identity cards issued by Department of Motor Vehicles (or equivalent)
- U.S. passport
- U.S. passport card
- DHS trusted traveler cards (Global Entry, NEXUS, SENTRI, FAST)
- U.S. military ID (active duty or retired military and their dependents, and DoD civilians)
- Permanent resident card
- Border crossing card
- DHS-designated enhanced driver's license
- Federally recognized, tribal-issued photo ID
- HSPD-12 PIV card
- Foreign government-issued passport
- Canadian provincial driver's license or Indian and Northern Affairs Canada card
- Transportation worker identification credential
- U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Employment Authorization Card (I-766)
- U.S. Merchant Mariner Credential

## VISITOR SCAN PROTOCOLS

All visitors to the HUD building (with few exceptions) are required to go through the magnetometers.

All bags and cell phones will go through the line scans. Packages, briefcases, or other containers brought within the HUD building are subject to inspection while on, or being removed from, the HUD building.

All visitors will be escorted in the HUD building by a HUD employee from the TRACS' Industry Group Meeting.

## VISITOR PROPERTY PASS

If attendees are bringing a personal equipment (e.g., laptop computers, tablets, etc.), they will be required to have a property pass when leaving the building, please download the [Federal Property Pass Form 7](#) from the HUD TRACS web page under “Announcements” and e-mail the completed Property Pass to TRACS@hud.gov with subject “HUD Property Pass Request.”
