Thank you for your letter of October 1, 2022, reminding this agency of the requirement to certify annually Texas' compliance with section 1616(e) of the Social Security Act, otherwise known as the Keys Amendment. The information included in this letter relative to Keys Amendment requirements applies to the 2023 federal fiscal year.

On behalf of the State of Texas, The Texas Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) hereby certifies Texas' compliance with section 1616(e) of the Social Security Act. The State of Texas complies with the Keys Amendment requirements through the combined efforts of the Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS), and HHSC.
