Minimum Weight and Density Requirements

PRODUCT CERTIFICATION:

MEA Certification shall certify that the carpet(s) described above conform to the requirements of this Materials Release (MR) and the following requirements:

- 1. MEA Certification shall issue to the carpet manufacturer: 1) a certification statement of conformance to this MR; and 2) a label, stamp, or mark containing the MEA Certification's validation mark *OR* the manufacturer's name or code identifying the manufacturer's plant location.
- 2. The certification label, stamp, or mark shall be applied to each carpet at least every six (6) feet, and not less than one (1) from the edge of the carpet.
- 3. MEA Certification shall visit each of the production facilities listed below every six (6) months. MEA Certification shall, as a minimum, review each of the production facility's Quality Control Manual (QCM), Quality Assurance procedures, in line testing, record keeping, and corrective actions. Records of such visits shall be made available in each production facility and in MEA Certification's headquarters.
- 4. MEA Certification shall collect from each production facility three (3) production samples every six (6) months. MEA Certifications shall collect one (1) annual sample from the market (i.e. distributor or dealer) not from the production facility. All samples shall be submitted by MEA Certification to a third party for testing in a laboratory accredited by the National Voluntary Laboratory Accreditation Program (NVLAP) of the U. S. Department of Commerce. The testing must include all minimum carpet requirements in Table 1 and the minimum weight and density requirements in Table 2 of this MR. Records of such tests shall be made available in each production facility and in MEA Certification's headquarters.

MANUFACTURER'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

Issuance of this MR commits the manufacturer to fulfill, as a minimum, the following:

- 1. Produce the products in strict accordance with the terms of this MR.
- 2. Label the carpet at least every six (6) feet and not less that one (1) foot from the edge of the carpet. Label should include the MEA identification number.
- 3. Provide necessary corrective action in a timely manner for all cases of justified complaint, poor performance or failure reported by HUD.
- 4. When requested, provide the Office of Manufactured Housing Programs, HUD Headquarters, with a representative list of properties in which the material, product or system has been used, including complete addresses or descriptions of locations and dates of installation.
- 5. Inform HUD, in advance, of changes in production facilities, methods, design, or materials used for this product, company name, ownership, or mailing address, within 30-days from the date the changes are made.
- 6. If in the interval between MEA Certification's quality assurance audits, changes are made to the product, HUD and MEA Certification shall be informed within 30 days of formal implementations of these significant changes.
- 7. Records of MEA Certification's audit visits report shall be made available in each production facility.

WARRANTY:

Mohawk Industries, Inc. warrants carpeting produced in accordance to this MR against manufacturing defects for a period of 5 years, and stain resistance for 5 to 7 years, depending on the specific carpet from the date of installation.

Mohawk warranty does not, in any way, relieve the builder of responsibility under the term of the Builder's Warranty required by the National Housing Act or under any pro-visions applicable to any other housing program. A copy of Mohawk Industries, Inc.'s warranty shall be furnished by the builder to the owner upon completion of the property.

Mohawk warrants that the surface pile will not be worn by abrasion more than 10% in five years when used in an indoor residential installation. If within the warranty period, the pile weight of the carpet, when compared to untrafficked area, loses more than 10% of its weight, Mohawk will provide a replacement carpet of comparable value for the affected area only (the worn and - adjacent areas extending to the nearest wall, doorway or entrance).

EVALUATION:

This MR shall be valid for a period of three years from the date of initial issuance or most recent renewal or revision, whichever is later. The holder of this MR shall apply for renewal or revision 90 days prior to the Review Date printed on this MR. Submittals for renewal or revision shall be sent to:

If the Department determines that a proposed renewal or supplement constitutes a revision, the appropriate User Fee for a revision will need to be submitted in accordance with the Code of Federal Regulations 24 CFR 200.934, "User Fee System for the Technical Suitability of Products Program," and current User Fee Schedule.

CANCELLATION:

Failure to apply for a renewal or revision shall constitute a basis for cancellation of the MR. HUD will notify the manufacturer that the MR may be canceled when:

- 1. Conditions under which the document was issued have changed so as to affect production of, or to compromise the integrity of the accepted material, product, or system;
- 2. The manufacturer has changed its organizational form, ownership, name, address, or production facilities, without notifying HUD; or,
- 3. The manufacturer has not complied with responsibilities it assumed as a condition of HUD's acceptance.

However, before cancellation, HUD will give the manufacturer a written notice of the specific reasons for cancellation and the opportunity to present views on why the MR should not be canceled. No refund of fees will be made on a canceled document.
