Dear Tribal Leader:

June is National Homeownership Month! I am writing to provide you with an update on the status Section 184 Home Loan Guarantee Program's regulations and to bring to your attention training opportunities and tools related to homeownership in Indian Country.

*Section 184 Regulations Update*

Thank you for participating in the series of consultation sessions ONAP held between February – May 2018 regarding the Section 184 Home Loan Guarantee Program's regulations. Your feedback and insights were invaluable. ONAP is currently drafting a proposed rule for tribal comment. The draft proposed rule will include early tribal feedback and will be sent to tribal leaders and housing executives for comment. Tribes will have a 60-day period to review the draft proposed rule. HUD anticipates having the draft ready for tribal review by the end of the summer.

*National Homeownership Month*

Since June is National Homeownership month, ONAP wanted to highlight the great work of the Confederated Tribes of Salish and Kootenai, which have expanded homeownership in their community by utilizing the Section 184 Program.
