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
MUCKLESHOOT HOUSING AUTHORITY (MHA)



- Located in King County
- Specifically in Auburn, WA
- Suburban, checkerboard reservation
- Approximately 3,300 Tribal Members

- 471 homes under MHA Management
 - 111 HUD funded (104 IHBG, 2 ARRA, 5 CARES funded)
 - 215 Tribally funded (18 lifetime estate,197 regular rental)
 - 145 Tribally funded Elder Homes
- 32 staff
- Tribally funded mortgage and consumer loan program
- Enrollment Growth of ~ 25% in the last 5 years
- Waiting List- 220 with a 2 year wait
 - 60% are very low income
- 27% of MHA units are considered "overcrowded"
- 62% of overcrowded units have at least 1 "high risk" occupant

The Housing Struggle is Real!



Muckleshoot Reservation = 6 square miles

How did we do it?

- BUILDABLE LOTS WERE ALREADY AVAILABLE
- ☐ CONSTRUCTION SPECIFICATION GUIDES WERE PROVIDED TO STAFF AND CONTRACTORS
- BID REQUEST LISTED ALTERNATES IN THIS CASE TWO
 - List price for appliances
 - Discount to MHA if awarded more than one home.
 - ACCOUNTING SOFTWARE- PROJECT COST SET UP AND GL CODING
 - PROPER COSTING OF LEVERAGED FUNDS.

New Home Construction

- 2 Bedroom 1 Bath 1130 sq ft. duplex 2260 total sq ft, \$216.12/sq ft.
- Appliances

MHA IT Improvements

- Upgraded HDS to Doorways cloud-based system
- Upgraded MHA financial systems to cloudbased system



Lessons Learned



- Always be on the lookout for land for sale near or on the reservation
- Update construction specifications with input from maintenance department
- Review and update inventory of building plans
- Cost analysis and scope to match submittals
- Anticipate 20% increase due to relations with foreign exporters (China tariffs (25%) on plywood and anti-dumping fee on plywood (76%))
- If new plans and new contractor-allow for increase in time to complete –at least an extra month
- Take pictures throughout the project

Confederated Salish & Kootenai Tribes of the Flathead Reservation

- Approximately 8,078 enrolled members with
 5,372 living on the reservation
- Located near the Flathead Lake on the Flathead Reservation in Northwest Montana
- Reservation covers 1,944 sq miles

Confederated Salish & Kootenai Tribes CARES Act Project

- Tribes received an allocation through the CARES Act from Department of Treasury
- Identified the need for a permanent supportive housing project
- Searched for a location that would work
- O Identified a run-down hotel on the reservation formerly known as the Starlight Motel
- Converted the motel into 14 single-occupancy units

CSKT CARES Permanent Supportive Housing Project Budget


TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- Create strong partnerships
 - CSKT Tribal Public Defenders Office will operate the units
 - CSKT Tribal Health Department and CSKT Department of Human Resources will provide supportive services
 - SKHA will provide project-based vouchers to subsidize rents
 - •Rely on the expertise and experience of others
 - OUnderstand the community needs and develop a comprehensive plan to address them
