Build America Buy America (BABA)

### **BABA:** WHAT IS IT?

- The <u>Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act</u>, signed on November 15, 2021, included **Build America**,
   Buy America Act (BABA) which is a law applying to all Federal agencies and all sources of Federal
   Funds
- BABA established the "Buy America" Preference
   (BAP) requirements for certain public infrastructure
   projects funded with Federal awards
- BABA Guidance is found at: 2 CFR Part 184 (<u>eCFR</u>:: 2 CFR Part 184 -- Buy America Preferences for Infrastructure Projects)

# BABA: WHAT DOES BAP COVER?

 Covered materials used in the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of infrastructure that will serve a public function must be sourced from producers and workers in the U.S. (unless a waiver determination is made & documented)

#### Covered Materials:

- Iron/steel
- Manufactured products (waived thru Sept. 30, 2026)
- Construction materials
- "Public Infrastructure" does NOT include singlefamily dwellings, which are defined as any structures with 1-4 dwelling units

# **BABA: NEW! JOINT GENERAL WAIVER FOR TRIBES**

- Eight Federal agencies, including HUD, issued a Joint General Waiver for Tribes effective Jan. 2025
- This new waiver applies to:
  - Awards and Subawards provided to Tribes, less than \$2.5 million they can be exempted from BAP requirements for the life of the award (for all awards obligated up to Jan. 2030)
  - For projects that must comply with BAP, purchases of noncompliant manufactured goods are allowable for all awards obligated through Sept. 30, 2026
- There is NO application/approval process to use this waiver, but you MUST document the basis of your determination


# BABA: NEW! JOINT GENERAL WAIVER FOR TRIBES (cont.)

#### Federal depts./agencies included in this waiver:

- > HUD
- Department of Agriculture
- Department of Commerce
- Department of Education
- Department of Energy
- Department of Interior
- Environmental Protection Agency
- Federal Emergency Management Agency

# **BABA:** WHEN DOES BAP APPLY?

1) Does the project budget include an award from a Fed. department NOT in the Joint Gen. Waiver for Tribes?



**NOTE:** If BAP does apply & cannot be waived, non-manufactured goods are exempt up thru Sept. 30, 2026

STOP! **BAP Can** Be Waived or BABA Can Be Found NOT to apply (Grantee is responsible for final determination and documentation)

# **BABA:** GENERAL vs. PROJECT-SPECIFIC WAIVERS

# **Project-Specific Waivers**

#### **Process:**

No waiver application/approval process

#### **Process:**

Multi-step waiver application process with final approval by OMB's Made in America Office

#### **Grantee's Role:**

Grantee is responsible for determining waiver applicability and maintaining supporting documentation in project file

#### **Grantee's Role:**

Grantee is responsible for preparing and submitting waiver request

#### **Waiver types:**

- Joint General Waiver for Tribes
- Exigent Circumstances (e.g., IT grants)
- Small Purchases
- DeMinimis

#### **Waiver types:**

- Public Interest
- Nonavailability
- Unreasonable Cost

# BABA: BAP APPLICABILITY ANALYSIS EXAMPLE

<u>Example:</u> A Tribal grantee was awarded a \$2 million FY24 ICDBG single-purpose grant for the construction of a community center. The total project cost is \$10 million. The Tribe was awarded the following funding from Federal and non-Federal sources. Does BAP apply?

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Example Funding Source	Does BAP Apply?	Explanation
\$2 Mil. FY24 ICDBG Single-Purpose Grant	NO	<\$2.5 million, under Joint General Waiver for Tribes BAP can be waived
\$3 Mil. FY20-FY23 IHBG Formula Grant	NO	Award obligated prior to 10/1/24
\$500k LIHTC	NO	Not a Federal Award
\$500k ICDBG-ARP Grant	NO	BABA does not apply to pandemic programs
\$1.5 Mil. Loan	NO	Not a Federal Award
\$2.5 Mil. FY24 Federal Grant	MAYBE	Consult w/Federal Funding Agency

# **BABA: WAIVER RECORD RETENTION REQUIREMENT**


- In the project file, document compliance with the BAP waiver/BABA applicability decision process
- Depending on the Waiver/Grounds, the Project File Should Contain Records Such As:
  - All of the Federal grant award amounts & sources
  - The type of project involved (e.g., whether it is for the construction, etc. of structures with 1-4 dwelling units)
- BEST PRACTICE Types of Records to Retain:
  - A statement that details the grounds for the BAP waiver/BABA applicability determination
  - 2. Supporting documentation, such as:
    - a. Federal Award Document
    - b. Project Description
    - c. Project Budget
