HUD MONITORING

Purpose of HUD Monitoring Review:

- Compliance with Regulations / Grant Agreement
- Carried out activities as described in application
- Made substantial progress
- Continuing capacity to complete activities timely
- Capacity to undertake specific planned activities
- Monitoring findings, audits, corrective actions
- Enforcement actions, complaints, correspondence

HUD MONITORING: AREAS OF REVIEW

- Procurement and Contract Administration
- 2. Relocation if applicable
- 3. Lead Based Paint if applicable
- 4. Sub-recipient Agreements
- 5. Environmental Review
- Compliance with approved grant application activities
- 7. Financial Systems Expenditure Report
- 8. Force Account compliance
- 9. Citizen Participation review



HUD MONITORING: AREAS OF REVIEW (cont.)

- 10. Housing Rehabilitation Requirements Cost limits, adopted policies, standards, expenditures review compared to cost summary
- 11.Land Acquisition Financial Commitment for future project (within two years)
- 12. New Housing CBDO Implementation, adopted construction standards
- 13. Public Facilities / Improvement Was an M&O Plan adopted, adhered to, in compliance with NOFO
- 14. Program Progress Implementation Schedule

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: CONTRIBUTING FACTORS

- Failure to comply with program requirements
- Failure to substantially carry out activities described in application
- Failure to make substantial progress toward carrying out approved activities
- Failure to show continued capacity to timely carry out approved activities

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: POTENTIAL ACTIONS


- Require progress reports
- Issue letter of warning:
 - Describing deficiencies
 - Identifying corrective actions
 - Describing more serious actions if deficiencies are not corrected
- Require the suspension of affected activities
- Require the reprogramming of remaining funds
- Require program reimbursement
- Change payment method
- Suspend LOCCS access

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: POTENTIAL ACTIONS (cont.)

- Reduction/withdrawal of grant
 - Requires opportunity for informal consultation
 - Exempts funds already expended on eligible activities
- Secretarial actions
 - Terminate or reduce grant
 - Limit availability of funds
 - Refer to Attorney General for possible civil action
 - Require opportunity for formal hearing
