SUBJECT: Mainstream Vouchers – Non-Competitive Opportunity for Additional Vouchers Authorized by the CARES Act and Extraordinary Administrative Funding, (Update)

1. PURPOSE

This notice increases the total amount of funding available for new Mainstream vouchers from \$40 million to \$48 million.

2. BACKGROUND

In PIH Notice 2022-07, HUD used its authority provided by the CARES Act to use Mainstream carryover funding from previous appropriations Acts to non-competitively award up to \$35 million in new Mainstream vouchers. PIH Notice 2022-19 increased the available funding for new Mainstream vouchers from \$35 million to \$40 million.

Through this notice, HUD is increasing the available funding for new Mainstream vouchers from \$40 million to \$48 million after additional funding has been identified. No new applications for Mainstream vouchers are being received through this Notice.
