WHO IS THE CHOCTAW NATION OF OKLAHOMA

- The Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma (CNO) is a "nonreservation" based American Indian Tribe federally recognized by the United States Secretary of the Interior.
- The Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma is a sovereign Tribe. Tribal sovereignty in the Untied States is the inherent authority of indigenous tribes to govern themselves within in the borders of the United States.



THE PEOPLE

- Our Tribal Service Area is home to 52,351 Native Americans, accounting for as much as 50% of the population in some communities.
- These numbers only account for the Tribal Members who live in The Choctaw Nation Service area. The Choctaw Nation currently has about 200,000 members.
- Our extremely rural region struggles with extreme poverty, unemployment, and low educational attainment.





SIZE AND AREA

- The CNO is defined as an extremely rural 10.5 county territory spanning over 11,000 square miles in southern Oklahoma, which encompasses about 15% of the states total area.
- CNO is the second largest tribal service area in the lower 48 states.
- This area of Oklahoma is more mountainous and forested than any other part of the state.

Service Coordination is a professional practice in which the Service Coordinator is a facilitator, advisor, educator, advocate and community services referral agent for the HACNO. The most fundamental role of a Service Coordinator is to link the elderly, people with disabilities, and lowincome families to supportive services and other community resources that ultimately empower them to live independently and become self-sufficient.



- **Recognize**...clients needs
- **Refer**...Service Coordinators research suitable programs by client need
- **Release**...giving the client the opportunity to connect with a suitable program



- Wrap around services- a team of individuals who collaboratively develop an individualized plan of care, implements this care and evaluates success over time.
- Self sufficiency- accepting responsibility, making your own decisions, and learning more practical skills.

Success Story



Twenty year old tribal member and LPN student in Idabel, Ok. was referred to the Service Coordination Department because she needed assistance with housing and budgeting. She started budgeting with a Service Coordinator, found a rental home and her positive actions began reflecting in her school work. With moving her into her own place and budgeting to save money, she was able to relieve stress and find her independence.

She graduated from nursing school on June 7th as Valedictorian and recently passed her NCLEX exam to become a Licensed Practical Nurse.



Success Story

A client reached out to the EnVision Facebook page wishing to find employment somewhere within the Choctaw Nation. She stated she had been a stay at home mom for over 10 years and was ready to help contribute financially to her family. The EnVision Center staff assisted her with job listings for her specified area and instructed her on how to create a profile and upload her resume. She received 3 job interviews in a couple of weeks. Around the same time The EnVision Center had organized an Interview Prep/Resume Building workshop in partner with Choctaw Career Development and invited her to attend. She attended the workshop and was able to learn about interview techniques and ways she could boost her resume. She contacted the EnVision Center a few weeks to inform the staff that she had received 2 job offers with the Choctaw Nation and had accepted one of the positions.
