HUD Handbook 1750.1, REV-4, CHG-2, National Security Information.

2. Changes and Additions:

On November 1, 1985, the President signed National Security Decision Directive 197 (NSDD-197), "Reporting Hostile Contacts and Security Awareness." The National Security Council has advised the Department to implement our program as proposed. The following procedures implement the Department's response to the requirements of NSDD-197:

- a. Create and maintain a security awareness program to inform

b. Provide for the prescribed reporting of employee contacts with nationals of certain foreign countries or political entities.

b. Procedures be established to govern contacts between media representatives and agency personnel with access to classified information, in order to minimize the opportunity for the negligent or deliberate unauthorized disclosure of classified

information.

- c. Individuals responsible for the unauthorized disclosure be denied further access to classified information.
- d. Unauthorized disclosures of classified information are promptly reported to the Department of Justice and the Information Security Oversight Office.

1. This Transmits:

HUD Handbook 1750.1 REV-4, National Security Information.

2. Changes and Additions:

Executive Order 12356, National Security Information replaces Executive Order 12065. The following major changes are designed to enhance the executive branch's ability to protect national security information from unauthorized or premature disclosure without increasing the quantity of classified information:

- a. The threshold standard for classification of information as "confidential" has been modified from "identifiable damage" to "damage." The reason for this change is to eliminate uncertainty regarding the intent of the term "identifiable."
- b. Another change to the requirements for classification is the addition of several subject matter categories of information (e.g., "cryptography" and "the vulnerabilities or capabilities of systems, installations, projects or plans relating to the national security") to the list of types of information that may be considered for classification.
- c. The new order eliminates the so-called "balancing test"; removes the limits on the duration of classification; and allows classifiers to continue to establish specific dates or events for declassification where that is appropriate.
- d. Another change made by the new order is the addition of a requirement that, in cases of doubt as to classification or proper level of classification, the information shall be

safeguarded as if it were classified pending a determination by an original classification authority, who shall make this determination within thirty (30) days.

- e. The new order also eliminates the prohibition against the reclassification of information previously declassified and released by providing that such information can be reclassified if it "may reasonably be recovered."

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- f. The order also broadens the scope of the presumption that disclosure of certain types of information will cause damage to the national security.
