RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On March 1, 2018, Petitioner was ordered to file documentary evidence to prove that Petitioner was not indebted to the Department in the amounts claimed by the Secretary. *Notice* of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral, dated April 5, 2018 ("Notice of Docketing".) Petitioner failed to comply with the Notice of Docketing. On December 19, 2018, Petitioner was issued a Show Cause Order again directing Petitioner to file documentary evidence, on or before January 15, 2019, to support her case. The Show Cause Order specifically stated that "[f]ailure to comply with this Order shall result in the immediate entry of judgment in favor of the opposing party or in the imposition of such other sanctions as the Administrative Judge deems necessary or appropriate in this case. See 24 C.F.R. §26.4(d)." (emphasis in original). Petitioner also failed to comply with the Show Cause Order. Accordingly, it is

ORDERED that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *sua sponte*, and *without prejudice*. It is

FURTHER ORDERED that the *Stay of Referral* previously entered in this case on March 1, 2018, is hereby **VACATED**.
