## **RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

On April 25, 2018, this court ordered Petitioner to file documentary evidence on or before June 8, 2018, in support of Petitioner's appeal. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated April 25, 2018. Petitioner failed to comply with that *Order*.
