RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On September 12, 2018, this Court ordered Petitioner to file documentary evidence on or before October 29, 2018, in support of Petitioner's appeal. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated September 12, 2018 ("*Notice of Docketing*".) Petitioner failed to comply with the *Notice of Docketing*. In her *Hearing Request*, Petitioner denied that she owed the alleged debt in this case, but failed to provide any explanation or evidence in support of her denial. Petitioner also claimed that repayment of the debt in this case would result in undue financial hardship for her, but did not submit documentary evidence to support her claim. Having failed to comply with the *Notice of Docketing*, Petitioner leaves this Court without evidence to consider Petitioner's claims that she does not owe the alleged debt in this case, or that repayment would result in financial hardship to her. Therefore, the appeal fails for want of prosecution. Petitioner's appeal is DISMISSED, *sua sponte*. It is

ORDERED that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *without prejudice*. The Stay of Referral to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered on September 12, 2018, is **VACATED**.
