## **RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

On February 11, 2019, this Court ordered Petitioner to file documentary evidence on or before March 13, 2019, in support of Petitioner's appeal. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral,* dated February 11, 2019. In her *Hearing Request,* dated November 30, 2018, Petitioner stated that she did not owe the alleged debt in this case, but provided no explanation or evidence whatsoever in support of her denial. Subsequent to the issuance of the *Notice of Docketing* on February 11, 2019, Petitioner also did not come forward with any documentary evidence in support of her position.
