**RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

On May 24, 2019, this Court ordered Petitioner to file documentary evidence on or before July 9, 2019, in support of Petitioner's appeal. *Notice of Docketing, Order, and Stay of Referral*, dated May 24, 2019. In his *Hearing Request*, Petitioner stated that he did not owe the alleged debt in this case, but provided no explanation or evidence whatsoever in support of his denial. Subsequent to the issuance of the *Notice of Docketing* on May 24, 2019, Petitioner also did not come forward with any documentary evidence in support of his position. Petitioner, having failed to comply with the *Notice of Docketing*, leaves this Court without evidence to consider Petitioner's appeal.

This appeal thus fails for want of prosecution. Petitioner's appeal is DISMISSED, *sua sponte*. It is

**ORDERED** that Petitioner's appeal is hereby **DISMISSED**, *without prejudice*. The Stay of Referral to the U.S. Department of the Treasury entered on May 24, 2019, is **VACATED**.
