

**RULING AND ORDER OF DISMISSAL**

On or about October 4, 2019, the Secretary filed the *Secretary's Motion to Dismiss* in this case, seeking dismissal of Petitioner's appeal on the grounds that "[t]he Secretary and Petitioner have agreed that Petitioner's wages will be garnished by HUD to repay his debt."
