ORDER GRANTING DISMISSAL

NOW COMES before the Court on January 3, 2020 Secretary's *Motion to Dismiss*, without prejudice, to collect the subject debt by means of administrative wage garnishment because the Secretary has determined that:


Petitioner has provided HUD's Financial Operations Center with letters from both his former and current employers indicating that Petitioner was involuntarily separated from his former place of employment and has not been continuously reemployed for at least 12 months. Therefore, while the Secretary believes Petitioner's debt is past due and legally enforceable, the Secretary moves to dismiss the instant administrative wage garnishment....

Upon due consideration, and for good cause shown, the Secretary's *Motion to Dismiss* is hereby **GRANTED**. HUD shall retain the right to seek administrative wage garnishment against Petitioner should Petitioner's financial circumstances change in the future.

The stay of referral issued on December 30, 2019 by *Notice of Docketing* is hereby VACATED shall it be determined in the future that Petitioner has otherwise become eligible.

This matter of HUDOHA No. 20-VH-0067-AG-040 is **DISMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE**.
