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## Statutory Requirement:

Housing and Economic Recovery Act (HERA) of 2008

- a) State agencies must provide to HUD:
  - Race;
  - Ethnicity;
  - Family Composition;
  - Age;

- Income;
- Use of Rental Assistance;
- Disability Status; and
- Monthly Rental Payments

- b) HUD's Responsibility:
  - Establish standards and definitions for the data collection; and
  - □ Provide States with technical assistance in establishing systems to compile and submit the data.
- c) Data must be collected at least annually and made publically available.
- d) No funds have been appropriated to support data collection.

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#### **Data Collection Forms**

- HUD is proposing to use two data collection forms:
  - Project Characteristics
  - Tenant Data
- Forms are currently in the required 60-day OMB review period.
- Following OMB review, the forms will be published as final.

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#### Initial Submission of Data

- First data collection will include:
  - 1. All properties placed into service in 2008 & 2009.
    - Plus, any omissions from previous years.
  - 2. All tenants in LIHTC units as of Dec. 31, 2009.
    - For initial submission, states are not expected to submit data not already in-house.
- States should prepare to submit data in the second half of 2010.



#### **Submission Details**

- 1. Following OMB approval, HUD will send specific instructions to states.
- 2. For initial submission, states are not expected to submit data not already collected from tenants.
  - States, however, should begin making plans to collect the data for the 2011 submission.
- 3. If annual certification not required (i.e. 100% low-income properties), submit most recent data.

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# Providing Assistance to States

- HUD contracted with Abt (and Pyramid as subcontractor) to provide assistance to states.
- Abt has begun contacting state agencies to assess needs.
- Needs will be prioritized and addressed to the extent possible.
- Funds are extremely limited for this contract and no grant money was appropriated.
