I. Purpose -- Form HUD-941-B is designed for use by HUD Field Office FHEO personnel who work with the Voluntary Compliance program and undertake annual evaluations of the HUD/NAHB Voluntary Affirmative Marketing Agreement (VAMA) with Builder Associations that have endorsed that Agreement.

- IA. When to Use -- The Regional and/or Field Office FHEO Directors in Category A Offices will develop annual evaluations of every VAMA that has been in execution for at least six months, as computed from date of execution by the A/S for FHEO or designee, usually the Regional Administrator.
- **IB.** How to Use -- This evaluation is made by HUD Field Office personnel. The information desired is obtained through observation and a review of Builder and CHRB records. A copy of the completed report form shall be sent promptly and simultaneously to the Regional Director, Office of FHEO and to the Assistant Secretary for FHEO: Attention: Director, Office of Voluntary Compliance. The local Builder and CHRB should also be provided with a copy of the completed form. The information collected on this form is to be provided by HUD employees on the basis of direct observation or from information contained in HUD files. This report has no public reporting burden because it is completed by HUD employees only. This report is exempt from the OMB clearance requirement under the Paper Reduction Act of 1980.
